


AYRS Newsletter

AYRS was at the RYA Dinghy Show which as usual was interesting I attended two of the lectures one of which was about the Foiling Courses to be started by the RYA, it sounds a good way to get started or even try it without risking a friends foiling boat.



The other was about the Land Rover BAR training scheme for up and coming sailors it sounds remarkably hard work but if you want to get on at the top end of competitive sailing essential.



The main theme of our stand was about the Peter Worsley's wing sail control system where a cam at the base of the mast is adjusted by a lever and the cams position controls the trim tab giving a range of angles of attack of the main wing giving no power (0 angle of attack no matter what the boats heading is) to max power depending on the displacement of the cam (I don't know what the prudent max. angle of attack is!) www.sailwings.net

Hints and tips



Nothing special just how I support my oars when recoating them. Just a block of wood with a hole that loosely fits the handle (left uncoated for grip) held a bench vice so that the loom is just sloping up from the horizontal, it is then firm, but by working outwards one can easily lift the loom a little to rotate it as you apply the finish, eventually reaching the tip of the blade and the very last bit you do without being able to rotate. Wear gloves to avoid skin grease and

wonder if using paint to hide the weathering etc might look smarter.
